Program Student Learning Outcomes

Students will be able to set goals, develop an Educational plan, make informed decisions and take appropriate action.

- Students will register for appropriate classes;
- Students will understand value of, and develop a relationship with, a counselor of student's choice;
- Students will make and keep appointments with counselors;
- Students will take responsibility for educational planning.

Students will be able to navigate the complexity of higher education and other organizations.

- Students will complete matriculation process.
- Students will maintain "good standing";
- Students will maintain progress toward educational goal;
- Students will demonstrate "system savvy."

Students will develop life skills resulting in mental and physical health and self-sufficiency.

- Students will demonstrate knowledge of physical and mental health related topics through HCD courses;
- Students will participate in physical and mental health workshops presented by Counseling Department personnel, other campus offices (e.g., Health Services), and/or community-based organizations;
- Students will have access to resource binder (or website) on physical/mental health information;
- Students will meet with Counselor on a regular basis.

Students will take responsibility as life-long learners in exploring a career path that includes: selection of major, pursuit of employment, transfer to higher education institutions, or further training as appropriate.

- Students will evaluate educational and/or career options through the use of appropriate decision-making tools and resources;
- Students will access and use current career and educational information;
- Students will experience quality career counseling.

Transfer Center SLO's:

Students will be able to demonstrate knowledge of what is required to transfer to four year institutions such as UCs, CSUs, and Private colleges by meeting with counselors, meeting with UC, CSU, and Independent reps, by taking HCD 310 courses, attending Transfer Day, going on campus tours and by utilizing services in the Transfer Center.
