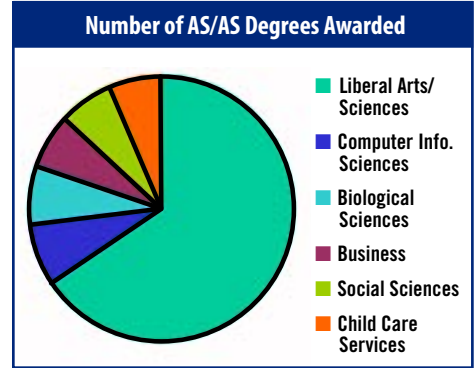

FUNDING

Community colleges still lag far behind K-12, California State University, and University of California in per student funding. Student fees were increased to \$26 per unit. For several years, the fees stood at \$11 per unit, so community college students have experienced at 137% increase in fees from 2002 to 2004. In addition, the increased revenue from students has allowed the community college share of Proposition 98 funding to fall to 10.25% in 2004-05, down from the statutory level of 10.93%, and the

average of 10.35% over the last few years. Prop. 98 funding per funded Full Time Equivalent Students (FTES) has gone down (in inflation adjusted dollars) by 8.6% since 2001-02.

CRC FOUNDATION

Cosumnes River College Foundation is positioned to invest the support of generous donors throughout the area. The Foundation provides for critical needs through endowed funds for student scholarships, faculty awards, purchases of equipment for every department, capital outlay and an enormous variety of programs and services for students and the community. 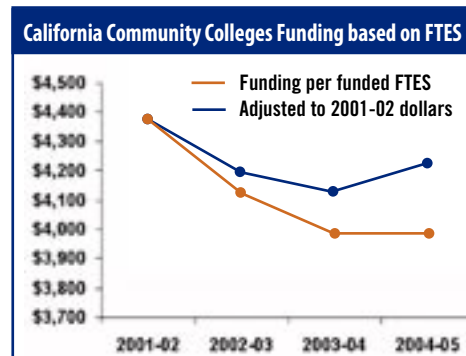
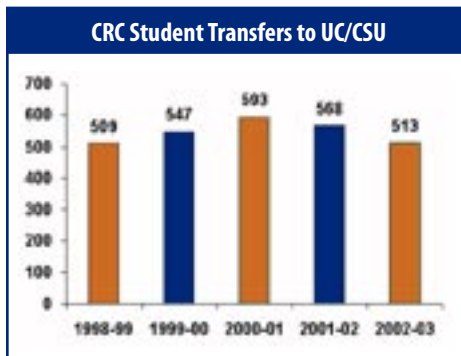
The Cosumnes River College Foundation is a tax-exempt, non-profit organization that was founded in 1983 as an auxiliary arm of the larger Los Rios Foundation. Its purpose is to promote the college as an outstanding educational facility and community center, to establish scholarships, grants and other assistance for students, to raise funds for the betterment of the College, its facilities and programs and to encourage donations in support of the College.

Donations to the Foundation can be made through gifts of cash, which allow the College to support the area with the greatest need, gifts of real and personal property, securities, insurance, or planned gifts such as bequests or trusts which are made through an estate.

The Foundation and the volunteer leaders who comprise the Foundation Board of Directors lead the advancement effort and are committed to building long term relationships between the College and community residents, alumni and local industry.

TRANSFER

Of the students who transfer from CRC to a UC campus, 57% attend UC Davis. Of those who transfer to a CSU, 79% attend CSU Sacramento.
