How do we define when a student is on a particular pathway in their first semester?	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• "First semester" is defined as first fall semester<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Include summer term as part of first fall start.• Broader definition preferred.<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Includes all first-time students (regardless of when they graduated from high school)• Measure both direct and non-direct matriculates, separately.• Consider index vs. measurement where index is a qualitative survey and measurement is actual measures/quantitative.• Include students who are late adds to the semester.• How do we define a student has entered a pathway?• For all comments/additional feedback please contact Alex, Sabrina or Paul	All	None

<p>How do we define a student has entered a pathway?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Enrolled in 12 units or more AND • Include CTE in the metric • Include either: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Declared major prior to the start of their first semester with an Ed Plan, or ○ Enrolled in math and English (“Safe Semester”) • What makes a “Safe Semester”? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The combination of declaring a major and completion of GE courses (math & English) ○ Does this place a student on an “early path” since they have not taken any courses in their major? • How can we define a part-time student on a pathway? • Pathway framework is about design—to help guide the students and promote behaviors to completion. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ What are we designing to support the behaviors towards on-time completion? • How do we define a student in: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Basic Skills pathway ○ CTE pathway ○ Degree pathway ○ Skill builder pathway • We need to keep in mind that we do not be too fine-grain with our definition that we end up unable to measure any outcomes. • Does the pathway support their educational goal? • What is “timely completion?” • A review of course enrollment cluster shows that with the exception of CTE/certificate programs, the similar course enrollment cluster is small (e.g., n <6 students). • Start with the end in mind (e.g., degree), how can a student get to the end? What is required? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ How many times should they see the counselor? ○ How many units are necessary to complete the program/major? ○ What is the students’ intended goal? • Focus on the index (e.g., timely completion of degree/transfer) and create the metric for that degree/transfer program. • Align/minimize (additional) data reporting <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Align with the State’s metric (e.g., number of students who complete in 3 yrs, number of completers, and number in-progress) • Incorporate career in the progress 	<p>All</p>	<p>None</p>
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How do we define when a student is on a particular pathway after their first semester?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Measure how many are still following the sequence of courses (outlined in the program templates) • Provide self-monitoring for the students (and the College need to be able to access the same self-monitoring tool). • Taking 30 units in their first year • Students change their majors quite frequently for various reasons and this may not be an accurate tool to assess staying on the path.
